
#### **Utkal Divas Celebration**

Date: 15<sup>th</sup> August 2021


The 75th Independence Day "Azadi ka Amrut Mahotsav" was celebrated in Centurion University, Bolangir Campus onAugust15th, 2021.

Date: 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2022







## Birth anniversary of Veer Surendra Sai and Netaji Subhash Bose


Date: 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2021




#### 5. National Science Day 28th February 2018

India celebrates its National Science Day every year on February 28 to mark Dr. C.V. Raman's discovery of the scattering of light, also known as the "Raman effect". The program had so many discussion on the CV Raman and his contribution one of the topic of discussion was about the Nature article on Secondary Radiation.

On March 31, 1928, *Nature* published a letter from CV Raman, titled "A new type of secondary radiation." The report writes that, "in every case in which light is scattered by the molecules, the diffuseradiation of the ordinary kind, having the same wave-length as the incident beam, is accompanied by a modified scattered radiation of degraded frequency." In simple words, there is a change of wavelength when light is scattered by different molecules. The changes depend on the molecules that are responsible for the scattering.






#### **Date: 2** October, 2018
