OBJECTIVE:

To assess the career aspirations of agricultural graduates and provide tailored guidance on various post-graduation pathways, including placements, higher studies, competitive exams, and entrepreneurship.

DESCRIPTION:

The Career Guidance Session, aimed at assisting agricultural graduates in making informed decisions about their post-graduation endeavors, was conducted by Mr. Chandrasekhar Sahu and Dr. Bandana Rani Barik. The session commenced with Mr. Sahu providing an overview of the diverse career options available to agricultural graduates, encompassing placements, higher studies, competitive exams, and entrepreneurship. Dr. Bandana Rani Barik then elaborated on the prospects and intricacies of pursuing higher studies in the agricultural domain, offering insights into academic programs and research opportunities.

Following the presentations, both coordinators engaged in interactive discussions with the students, individually gauging their interests and aspirations post-graduation. Students were encouraged to express their preferences regarding career paths, enabling the coordinators to provide personalized guidance and support. Upon completion of the session, the data regarding students' career interests were compiled and forwarded to the placement cell for further action.

OUTCOME:

- 182 students expressed interest in pursuing placements, indicating a strong inclination towards entering the workforce immediately after graduation.
- 65 students demonstrated interest in pursuing higher studies, reflecting a desire for advanced academic and research opportunities in the agricultural field.
- 20 students expressed interest in preparing for competitive exams, signaling a commitment to pursuing careers in government or competitive sectors.
- 5 students showed interest in entrepreneurship, highlighting a burgeoning interest in venturing into agricultural innovation and business ventures.
