

7.1.9 Sensitization of students and employees of the Institution to the constitutional obligations: values, rights, duties and responsibilities of citizens

Response:

CUTM is committed to making students, faculty, and staff aware of and sensitive to their constitutional obligations. Students are sensitized through courses such as Gender, Human Rights, and Ethics, as well as through participation in activities organized by CUTM's Culture and Social Responsibility unit (during Republic Day and Independence Day Celebrations in which Flag hoisting and other activities are conducted). Furthermore, workshops are held throughout the year for the University's faculty and staff to educate them on the interconnected issues of 'Rights, Duties, and Responsibilities' as an Indian citizen. On various National Days, such as International Human Rights Day, International Mother Language Day, International Women's Day, National Women's Day, International Day for the Disabled, World AIDS Day, Environment Day, and Science Day, this is done at the university level. External constitutional experts have been invited to give talks on the aforementioned issues. The legal implications of all of these articles are also discussed in great detail in the workshops, which sparks a lot of debate about how there is a mismatch between what the Constitution provides and what people in society do on a daily basis.
