

## Track and reduce food waste across Campus

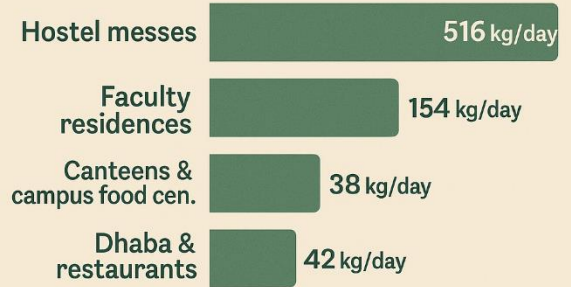
Food waste at Centurion University presents a significant sustainability concern, with daily waste generation now reaching 750 kg across major campus sources. Hostel messes are the largest contributors, producing 516 kg/day, followed by faculty residences at 154 kg/day (As per the audit has been done by Centre for Envotech and Management Consultancy Pvt. Ltd., Bhubaneswar). Canteens and campus food centres, including the CCC, Baking Unit, and Mini Dairy, collectively add 38 kg/day, while the campus Dhaba and restaurants account for 42 kg/day. This study evaluates food waste generation based on data collected during peak operational periods, when hostels, faculty residences, and dining facilities were functioning at full capacity.

### Food Waste Generation on Campus

A significant sustainability concern, with daily waste generation now reaching 750 kg across major campus sources.

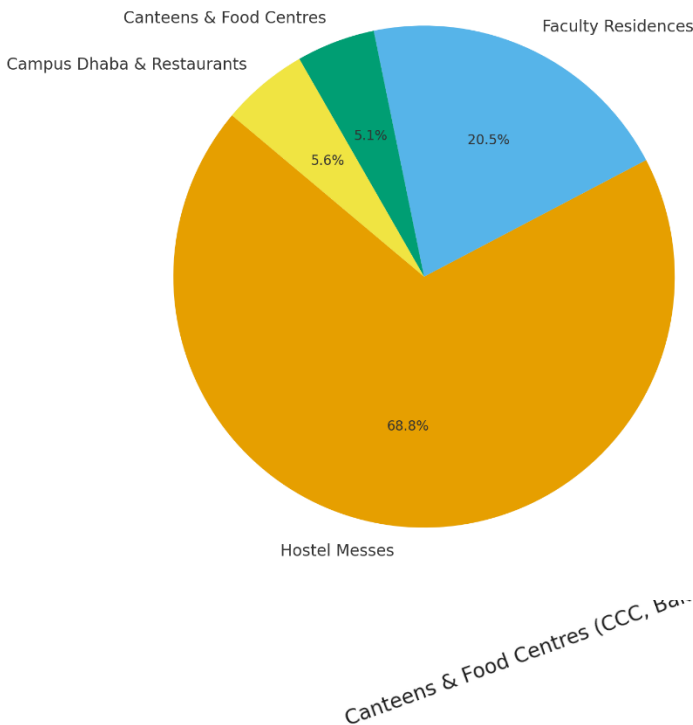

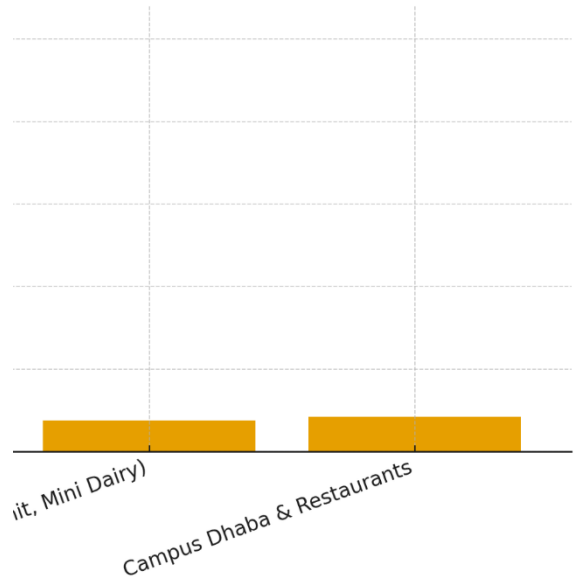

Centurion University has institutionalised a robust food waste monitoring system through a professional audit conducted by the Centre for Envotech and Management



Consultancy Pvt. Ltd. (CEMC), Bhubaneswar, under the leadership of Dr. B.N. Sahoo, Chief Executive Head. The audit established a revised baseline of 750 kg/day of food waste during peak operational periods, with detailed contributions including 516 kg from hostels, 154 kg from faculty residences, and 80 kg from canteens and restaurants. Notably, Centurion University enforces mandatory food waste tracking for all outsourced food service providers through strict contractual obligations.
