INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this policy and associated procedures is to maintain a healthy environment at Centurion University of Technology and Management, Odisha by defining all University premises as Smoke-Free, Drug free and Alcohol-free environments. The University has an obligation under the **Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act (COPTA), 2003, Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act 1985** (amended on 2014), Odisha Excise Act, 2008[#] (Alcohol being a state subject) and also ensuring the Article 21 of Constitution of India; Protection of Life and Personal Liberty to promote a smoke free, drug free and alcohol-free environment and protect the health and well-being of all. Invoking these legislations, the University is declared as smoke free, drug free and alcohol free environment.

*Alcohol being a state subject and the legal drinking age in the state of Odisha is 21 but the University campus is declared as alcohol free.

DEFINITIONS

The following definitions apply for the purpose of this policy:

- a) University Premises all land, property and any location/site whether on or off campus that may be under the control of the University or in use by the University for commercial, academic and/or research purposes, irrespective of whether the University is the owner, commercial occupier or simply a temporary user of the land, property or location/site;
- b) University vehicles include University used vehicles such as buses, vans, cars, tractors, etc. It also includes all personal vehicles used by all employees, students and visitors;
- c) Environmental Tobacco Smoke (ETS) smoke that comes from the burning of a tobacco product and smoke that is exhaled by smokers. Inhaling environmental tobacco smoke is called involuntary passive smoking;
- d) Tobacco Products includes all tobacco, cigarette, cigar, water pipe, betel (paan), ghutka or any other product containing tobacco designed for human consumption or use;
- e) Drugs: Includes all opium derivatives, opium poppy, poppy straw, cannabis and all such drugs defined in the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act 1985 (amended on 2014).
- f) Alcohol: Alcohol means ethyl alcohol of any strength and purity having the chemical composition C_2H_5 OH and all other such as defined in the **Odisha Excise Act 2008**.

POLICY STATEMENT

- a) Smoking, drinking and drugs are prohibited on all University premises. The University has a responsibility to minimize adverse environmental effects and has committed in its Environmental Management Policy to reduce pollution and waste. The University is required to comply with the Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act (COPTA), 2003, <u>Environment (Protection) Act. 1986</u>, Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981 and Narcotics Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985, Odisha Excise Act 2008 and is obliged under India's ratification of the World Health Organization (WHO) Framework Convention on Tobacco Control to protect all people from exposure to tobacco smoke.
- b) Smoking, drinking and drug usage is also prohibited at and around all entrances to University premises.
- c) This policy applies to all persons on University premises.
- d) The University is committed to ensuring the health, safety and welfare of its employees whilst at work and its students and visitors while on campus. The University has adopted the following principles:
- All persons on University Premises are entitled to a smoke-free environment;
- Smoking, drinking and drug usage is prohibited, at all times, in University vehicles;
- Smoking, drinking and drug usage is prohibited, at all times, on any approved University fieldwork activity where other persons may be exposed to Environmental Tobacco Smoke (ETS), alcohol and drugs either actively or passively.

e) Sale of all drugs, alcohol, tobacco products and electronic nicotine delivery systems or e-cigarettes is prohibited on University Premises.

PROCEDURES

Part A - Responsibilities

- a) The Chief Security Officer (CSO), Chief Mentor (CM), supervisors of areas, staff and students under their responsibility, must:
- Ensure that the staff and students are aware of this policy and create awareness about the policy;
- Understand their roles and responsibilities to ensure the policy is enforced;
- Ensure complaints with regard to alleged breaches of the policy are dealt expeditiously, effectively and efficiently.

- b) All persons on University Premises:
- Must not smoke anywhere;
- Must not drink alcohol or its derivate;
- Must not take drugs of any form as defined in the relevant act;
- Must cooperate with the University in the implementation of this policy;
- In case of any non-compliance, the grievance is presented before the CSO, CM and other security personnel for redressal.
- c) University hostel and general administration will
- Use signage to reflect that the University is a smoke-free, drug free and alcohol free educational institution and workplace.
- Update signage, as part of the normal update cycle.
- d) Volunteers and inspectors
- Volunteers and internal inspectors are appointed by the management of the University. They have the authority to collect information on breaches of the Act and Regulations and bring it to notice of CSO and CM.
- The inspectors are prima facie authorized to impose monetary penalties as enforceable by the law;

Part B - Dealing with Non-Compliance

Under the Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act (COPTA), 2003, Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act 1985 amended on 2014, Odisha Excise Act, 2008 fines can be imposed by Inspectors, and also by CSO, CM for breaches of the act. The amount of the fine is as applicable under the act at the time of the offence.

Part C - Assistance for Smokers, Drug Abusers and Alcohol Consumers

The University recognizes that some staff and students may require assistance to quit smoking. Counselling and referrals services are available for both students and employees.

Part D - Policy Dissemination

It is important that all persons on University premises are aware of this policy. This will be facilitated as much as possible via the following means (but not limited to)

- The CM is the nodal officer for policy dissemination at the University.
- The dissemination methods includes, orientation, campaigns, visuals, signage and others.
- CM will host regular awareness campaign in the community through various methods as necessary.
