Extension Activities and Community Engagement

Centurion University of Technology and Management (CUTM) actively engages in initiatives that foster community development, enhance student sensitivity to social issues, and promote holistic development. The University focuses on improving employability for school dropouts, skill-integrated higher education, and social-entrepreneurial outreach to establish a student-centric learning ecosystem. Over 50% of student projects address real-world community or organizational challenges, strengthening practical problem-solving abilities.
