GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE

School of Law Committee

The School of Law Committee shall comprise:

- All Professors, Associate Professors, and Assistant Professors assigned to teach law courses
- The Dean/Head of School of Law as the Chairperson
- The Vice-Chancellor shall nominate the Dean/Head of School of Law

Committee Functions:

- Supervise the overall functions of the 3-Year LLB Programme
- Make necessary recommendations on academic, examination, and other academic-related matters
- Monitor curriculum implementation and suggest improvements
- Oversee faculty development and research initiatives

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

The medium of instruction and examination shall be **English only**.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY

Core Approaches:

- **Lecture Method:** Traditional classroom instruction with faculty-led discussions
- **Seminar Approach:** Student presentations and group discussions on specialized topics
- **Tutorial System:** Small group sessions for doubt clarification and in-depth analysis
- **Case Study Method:** Analysis of landmark judicial decisions and legal precedents
- **Clinical Legal Education:** Practical exposure through legal aid clinics and court visits
- **Moot Court Exercises:** Mock trial simulations to develop advocacy skills
- **Internship Programme:** Mandatory practical training with law firms, courts, or legal organizations

Practical Components:

- **Legal Research and Writing:** Development of legal research skills and professional writing abilities
 - **Client Counseling:** Training in client interview techniques and legal counseling
 - **Alternative Dispute Resolution:** Hands-on experience with mediation, arbitration, and conciliation
 - **Professional Ethics:** Integration of ethical considerations throughout the curriculum
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ASSESSMENT AND EVALUATION SYSTEM

Examination Committee Structure

An Examination Committee will be constituted by the Vice-Chancellor to supervise and monitor the evaluation of the 3-year LLB programme.

Assessment Components (Per Course - 100 Marks Total)

Internal Assessment (30 Marks):

1. **Mid-Semester Examination (15 Marks)**
 - 5 Short Questions × 1 mark = 5 marks
 - 2 Long Questions × 5 marks = 10 marks
2. **Assignments/Moot Court Exercises (10 Marks)**
 - Written assignments as specified in syllabus
 - Moot court exercises for practical papers
3. **Class Participation and Attendance (5 Marks)**
 - Regular attendance and active participation
 - Tutorial and seminar contributions

End-Semester Examination (70 Marks):

- Comprehensive written examination covering the entire syllabus
- 3-hour duration per paper
- Question paper pattern aligned with university standards

Grading System:

- **Grade Point Average (GPA)** system as per university policy
- **Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)** for overall performance
- Letter grades assigned based on percentage of marks obtained

Minimum Requirements:

- **Total Credits for Degree:** 120 Credits
 - **Passing Marks:** As per University Examination Rules
 - **Minimum Attendance:** 75% in each subject
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ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS

Mandatory Attendance Policy:

- Students must attend a minimum of **75% of classes** in every semester
- Attendance below 75% will result in debarment from semester examinations
- Medical leave and emergencies considered as per university guidelines
- Make-up classes arranged for students with valid reasons for absence

Attendance Monitoring:

- Daily attendance records maintained for each course
 - Monthly attendance reports shared with students and parents
 - Warning notices for students with attendance below 70%
 - Counseling sessions for chronic attendance issues
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PROMOTION AND PROGRESSION

Semester Promotion:

- Promotion to next semester allowed upon passing current semester examination
- Students failing in not more than 2 courses may be promoted with re-registration requirement
- Failed courses must be cleared through supplementary examinations

Re-registration Process:

- Students with failed courses (maximum 2 per semester) may re-register
- Re-registration fee charged as per university fee structure
- Maximum of 2 attempts allowed for clearing failed subjects
- Third attempt requires special permission from Academic Committee

Academic Probation:

- Students failing in more than 2 courses placed on academic probation
 - Enhanced academic performance standards during probation
 - Counseling and additional academic support provided
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INTERNSHIP AND CLINICAL REQUIREMENTS

Mandatory Internship:

- Minimum **12 weeks** of internship spread across semesters V and VI
- Internship with practicing advocates, law firms, courts, legal aid organizations
- Supervised evaluation through structured reporting and assessment

Clinical Legal Education Components:

- Legal aid clinic participation
- Court observation and case study preparation
- Community legal awareness programmes
- Alternative dispute resolution practice sessions

Moot Court Participation:

- Mandatory participation in internal moot court competitions
 - Encouragement for inter-university and national competitions
 - Credit allocation for exceptional performance
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EXAMINATION CONDUCT AND POLICIES

Examination Schedule:

- Mid-semester examinations as per academic calendar
- End-semester examinations at conclusion of each semester
- Supplementary examinations for failed students

Examination Conduct:

- Strict adherence to university examination guidelines
- Anti-plagiarism measures for assignments

- Disciplinary action for examination malpractices
- Appeal mechanism for examination-related grievances

Result Declaration:

- Timely declaration of results as per academic calendar
 - Detailed mark sheets with subject-wise performance
 - CGPA calculation and class ranking
 - Transcripts available for academic and professional purposes
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DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

Completion Criteria:

For award of LLB degree, students must:

- Successfully complete all 120 credits across 6 semesters
 - Secure minimum required CGPA as per university rules
 - Complete all practical requirements including internship
 - Clear all backlogs within maximum time limit of 6 years
