## TEACHING METHODOLOGY

The teaching methodology emphasizes:

### Core Approaches:

# ASSESSMENT AND EVALUATION SYSTEM

## Examination Committee Structure:

An Examination Committee will be constituted by the Vice-Chancellor to supervise and monitor the evaluation of undergraduate law courses. The committee will ensure standardized assessment practices across all semesters.

## Question Paper Setting and Moderation:

- Course instructors will frame question papers for their respective subjects
- All question papers will be reviewed by a Moderation Committee before finalization
- Joint question paper setting and evaluation for courses taught by multiple faculty members
- External expert involvement for specialized subjects when required

## Assessment Components:

### For Each Course (100 Marks Total):

#### Continuous Assessment (50 Marks):

1. **Mid-Semester Written Examination (20 Marks)**
  - **Mark Distribution:**
    - 5 Short Questions × 1 mark = 5 marks
    - 2 Long Questions × 5 marks = 10 marks
    - 2 Short Notes × 2.5 marks = 5 marks
2. **Presentation (10 Marks)**
  - **Evaluation Rubric:**
    - Content & Creativity = 5 marks
    - Presentation & Discussion = 5 marks
3. **Assignments (10 Marks)**
  - 2 Assignments × 5 marks each
4. **Learning Record (10 Marks)**
  - Based on parameters indicated in the learning record format
  - Course faculty to evaluate and award scores according to established criteria

#### End-Semester Examination (100 Marks):

- Comprehensive written examination covering the entire syllabus
- Question paper pattern to be aligned with university standards

## Semester-wise Assessment Structure:

### Semesters I-X:

- **Continuous Assessment:** 50 marks
- **End-Semester Examination:** 100 marks
- **Total per course:** 100 marks

## **Additional Assessment Components:**

### **Clinical Legal Education:**

- Practical assignments and case work evaluation
- Viva voce examinations for clinical exposure
- Assessment of professional skills development

### **Internship Evaluation:**

- Performance evaluation by supervising advocate/organization
- Internship report submission and presentation
- Reflection journal on practical learning experiences

**Learning Records:** Students are expected to maintain comprehensive learning records as guided by faculty mentors, including:

- Case law analysis and legal research documentation
- Attendance at court proceedings and legal seminars
- Participation in legal aid activities
- Professional development activities

### **Grading System:**

- Marks will be provided in accordance with CGPA and SGPA format as per university examination policy
- Letter grades will be assigned based on percentage of marks obtained
- Class rankings will be calculated based on cumulative performance

### **Minimum Requirements:**

- **Minimum Credits Required for Degree:** 240 Credits
- **Passing Marks:** as per University Exam Rules.
- **Overall Passing:** as per University Exam Rules.

## **ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS**

### **Mandatory Attendance Policy:**

- Students must attend a minimum of **75% of classes** (combined online and offline sessions) in every semester
- Attendance below 75% will result in debarment from semester examinations
- Medical leave and other emergencies will be considered as per university guidelines
- Make-up classes may be arranged for students with valid reasons for absence

### **Attendance Monitoring:**

- Daily attendance records to be maintained for each course
  - Monthly attendance reports to be shared with students and parents
  - Warning notices for students with attendance below 70%
  - Counseling sessions for students with chronic attendance issues

## **PROMOTION AND PROGRESSION**

### **Semester Promotion:**

- Promotion to the next semester is allowed only upon passing the current semester examination
- Students failing in not more than two courses may be promoted to the next semester with re-registration requirement
- Failed courses must be cleared through supplementary examinations or re-registration

### **Re-registration Process:**

- Students with failed courses (maximum 2 per semester) may re-register for those subjects
- Re-registration fee will be charged as per university fee structure
- Maximum of two attempts allowed for clearing failed subjects and/or as per University Exam Rules.
- Third attempt requires special permission from Academic Committee and/or as per University Exam Rules.

### **Academic Probation:**

- Students failing in more than two courses in any semester will be placed on academic probation
- Probationary students must maintain enhanced academic performance standards
- Counseling and additional academic support provided during probation period

### **Backlog Clearance:**

- All backlogs must be cleared before proceeding to the final semester
  - Final degree will be awarded only after successful completion of all 240 credits
  - Supplementary examinations will be conducted as per university academic calendar

### **Mandatory Internship:**

- Minimum 25 weeks of internship spread across different semesters
- Internship with practicing advocates, law firms, courts, legal aid organizations, or corporate legal departments

- Supervised internship evaluation through structured reporting and assessment

- Legal aid clinic participation
- Court observation and case study preparation
- Community legal awareness programmes
- Alternative dispute resolution practice sessions

#### **Moot Court Participation:**

- Mandatory participation in internal moot court competitions

  - Credit allocation for exceptional performance in moot court activities
