## Introduction :

The **Department of Mining Engineering**, School of Engineering and Technology (SoET), Centurion University of Technology and Management (CUTM), **Bhubaneswar**, successfully organized a **First Aid Training Interaction Program** in collaboration with **St. John Ambulance, Odisha** on **2<sup>nd</sup> August 2025** at the **Seminar Hall, Aryabhata Building**. It also aligned with CUTM's commitment to **industry-relevant education**, making students not only technically sound but also safety-conscious professionals.

## Key Activities :

The **First Aid Training Interaction Program** was held from **11:00 AM to 1:00 PM** in the **Seminar Hall, Aryabhata Building**. The session began with a **formal welcome address** by faculty members of the **Department of Mining Engineering, SoET, CUTM**.

The **Secretary of St. John Ambulance, Odisha**, along with his **team of government officials**, served as the **chief guests and trainers** for the session. They delivered an **interactive lecture** covering the **importance of first aid, the role of immediate response in saving lives, and its critical relevance in the mining sector**.

Participants were given **live demonstrations** on handling injuries, burns, fractures, and bleeding, along with techniques such as **CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation), wound dressing, and patient transportation methods**. Students were also encouraged to **engage in practical activities**, practicing basic techniques under the trainers' guidance.

The session concluded with an **open interaction**, where students clarified their doubts about health emergencies and shared their reflections on the learning experience.

## Key Highlights :

- **Hands-On Demonstrations:** Practical sessions on CPR, wound care, fracture management, and patient transport.
- **Focused on Mining Safety:** Emphasis on emergency preparedness in hazardous mining environments.
- **Active Student Participation:** 70 Mining Engineering students, including Diploma students, engaged in the program.
- **Practical Relevance:** Directly linked to real-world applications in industrial and mining operations.

## Key Outcomes :

- **Improved Safety Awareness:** Students gained knowledge of first aid protocols and their importance.
- **Practical Skills Development:** Hands-on training improved confidence in handling emergencies.
- **Mining-Specific Applications:** Participants understood the role of first aid in preventing fatalities in mines.
- **Confidence Building:** Students learned to respond calmly and effectively during accidents.
- **Career Readiness:** The training added value to students' professional preparedness in the mining industry.

## Future Scope :

This program has opened opportunities for **regular safety and first aid workshops** at CUTM. Future sessions may focus on **advanced life support training, disaster management, and occupational health awareness**. Collaborations with **St. John Ambulance and other health organizations** will be strengthened to provide **certification programs** for students. Additionally, such training can be integrated into the **Mining Engineering curriculum**, ensuring students graduate with both technical expertise and **safety competency**. Over time, CUTM aims to position itself as a leader in promoting **safety education and workplace health practices** in technical education.

## Feedback from Participants:

Participants expressed their **appreciation for the interactive and practical nature** of the session. They felt that the **live demonstrations** made the concepts easy to understand and applicable to real-life scenarios. Many students mentioned that this was their **first exposure to professional first aid training**, and it significantly boosted their **confidence in handling emergencies**. Diploma students emphasized that the knowledge gained would be **highly beneficial in their future careers**, especially in industries with high safety risks like mining. The participants suggested conducting **longer-duration training programs** with more advanced modules and **periodic refreshers** to keep their skills up to date. Overall, the feedback highlighted the **relevance and usefulness** of the program in building a culture of safety among students.
