Agenda No.2: Preparation of AQAR for the year 2020-21

A review of the preparations so far was done and improvements and modifications in the presentation of information were suggested.

Agenda No.3: Quality Improvement Initiatives

As per discussion in the Research review meeting, each faculty need to publish at least 3 papers in reputed journals.

Faculty were asked to upgrade their skill competency by completing various courses in Courseware.

Many e-contents were prepared and posted on CUTM Courseware. The same was reviewed by the Senior Management Team and suggestions were given for improvement.

Virtual labs were also tried to make students able to do labs through open platforms and remote desktop facilities.

Faculties were asked to update all the NAAC files again based on the change of new NAAC template.

Mentors were asked to keep a track of the activities of students in summer internship program (1000 summer interns) which was launched for the first time on 13th May 2022.

Faculty Awards were announced on the eve of Teachers Day in the event called "Provost's Research Conclave" on 5th September, 2022.

Plan of action based on Academic Audit Report of 2019-20 was discussed. It was decided that the Deans/HoDs will plan a course of action for their respective schools/departments to address the shortcomings and work upon the recommendations.

It was considered to update http://courseware.cutm.ac.in with all learning materials. The courseware is digitally aligned to facilitate online learning. All core and domain courses were updated.

It was decided that the Learning Records for all theory and practice courses need to be verified (random samples) by Deans. A new format of learning record was circulated and students were instructed to send updated learning records in the latest format which includes learning outcomes from classroom sessions as well as the field projects.

The students of School of Paramedics and Allied Health Sciences, during their final semester are visiting reputed hospitals in and around Odisha, for the purpose of fulfilling their Internship and Project.

A new program was introduced in Master in Public Health for career growth of Students in the health industry.

New skill course of Apiculture was designed and was placed for BOS approval. Students have registered in SFS (Skill for Success) course and they are pursuing the skill courses along with their core courses as well. Job readiness training is also being provided to the students completely in practice mode which is of six credits and it has been made compulsory for all students.

Placement training is being imparted through the MyPerfectice platform. It conducts online baseline test for the students as well as subsequent tests for the students to increase their placement worthiness. Review meetings regarding placement activities are being held regularly at least three days a week.

Mentors are regularly interacting with students and parents and informing them about classes, pending fee payments, attendance monitoring and EoD as when required. Academic updates and personal problems of mentees are intimated to the parents.

The orientation program for 1st Semester students of the academic year 2022-23 was conducted from 9th -20th September, 2022.
