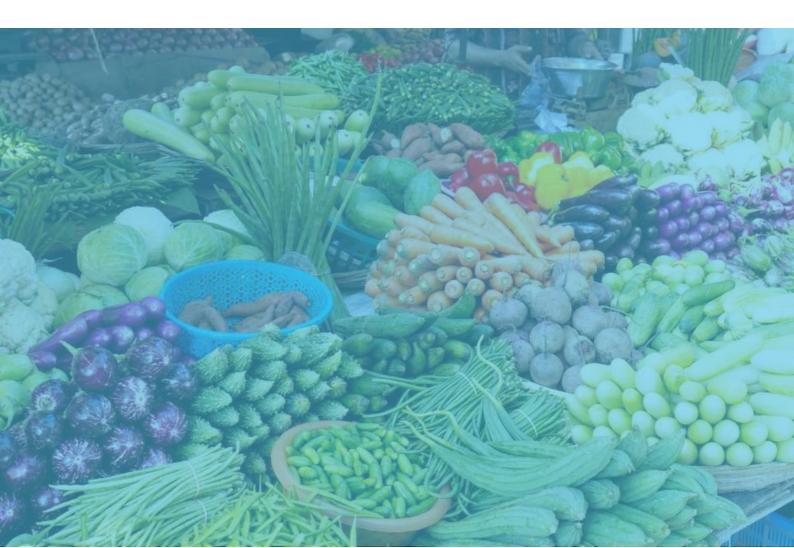


FARM-FRESH FEASTS: PLATEFULS FROM THE LOCAL BOUNTY
